- **Paid work for the MCR**
 - The graduate body is an **under-used resource**. The College is increasing its spending on undergraduates following recent Norrington Table under-performance. I want graduates to benefit from this.
 - As JCR-MCR Liaison, I've been given permission to run a pilot graduate teaching scheme this Trinity, with a **£3000 budget** for the provision of undergraduate revision classes, paid at **£25/hour**. As President, I want to make this permanent next year.
 - If successful, I will push for a larger budget to cover study skills sessions with first-year undergraduates.
- **Experienced student rep**
 - I have been JCR Academic Rep, Addison Society President, and JCR-MCR Liaison Officer. I am familiar with the workings of the College, and have **good relationships with staff**.
 - I know that it's sometimes necessary to be **firm in order to defend student interests**. As Academic Rep, I ran the first OUSU-accredited academic feedback sessions in Queen's, and later defended them at committee-level against Fellows opposed to the process.
- **Support the activities of the MCR community**
 - I want to ensure that the diverse interests of the MCR community are **supported and show-cased**.
 - Next year, the College are setting up **a fund of ~£20,000** to support the activities of its student body. I will make publicising this a priority, and will **push for graduates to be well-represented** in its allocation.
