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1. Recruiting for identity experiment – Chance to win an iPad!

Use social media (e.g., Facebook, Twitter, Google+, Flickr, etc.)? Signed up to (and use!) any of the variety of public web sites and web services online (e.g., eBay, Amazon, LinkedIn, etc.)? Want to participate in an interesting experiment on online identity AND want a chance at winning an iPad? We want you!

The Cyber Security Group in the Department of Computer Science is about to conduct a comprehensive experiment focused on online identity. Our aim is to gain a better understanding of the type of presence that individuals maintain online, while also investigating what else can be inferred from such a presence.

For our experiment, we are recruiting undergraduate and masters students in mathematics and computer science particularly, but students of other disciplines may apply (at any stage of their degree). The main requirement is that you have some reasonable online presence, demonstrated via use of social media and other online sites. As a part of this study, with your permission we will be aggregating information about the types of online data you share online (that is, data that you make available to the public and your friends – not personal messages!) with the aim of understanding how you tend to use such online sites. We would like to emphasise that we focus mostly on types of data (e.g., whether you share your address OR not) and not the actual data values themselves (i.e., we will not collect your address). Furthermore, all data we obtain from your accounts will only be used for the purposes of conducting this experiment. More information can be provided upon request, and will be provided before participation.

- 1. Your name, degree, and year level.
- 2. A bulleted list of all of the social-media services that you use (and have an account on), and for each one, the number of times per month that you do any of the following: post messages, update information, upload content, etc. Additionally, please include roughly how long you have been using this site (e.g., 1 year, 3 years, etc.). Sites could include: Facebook, Twitter, Google+, Flickr, Instagram, LinkedIn, YouTube, Online Communities (e.g., Reddit, Digg, Yahoo! Answers, StackOverflow), Blogs (WordPress, Blogger, Tumblr) 3. A bulleted list of all of the other online sites and services that you use (and have an account on), and for each one, the number of times per month you interact (i.e., upload content etc.) with them. Areas of interest include, but are not limited to, services/sites used for gaming (e.g., Steam), those used to purchase or sell items (e.g., eBay, Amazon), those used to write reviews (e.g., TripAdvisor, Yelp, FourSquare), those used for music (e.g., LastFM), or those used for Programming (e.g., GitHub). Please do feel free to list other sites that you have a profile on. For all sites included, also include how long you have been using them.

Please note that recruitment is on a first-come-first-recruited basis. The first students that fulfil the requirement above will be chosen. If you are unsure whether you fit, do contact us at<u>isicstudy@cs.ox.ac.uk</u><mailto:<u>isicstudy@cs.ox.ac.uk</u>> with the information requested and we can make the decision.

Finally, this experiment has been reviewed by, and received ethics clearance through, the University of Oxford Central University Research Ethics Committee (CUREC).
